 - b. Introductions- Who are the people in your Student Center?
 - i. Kathy Bitner (7th grade), Jody Jensen (part-time, all), Megan Gebhard (8th grade), Kimberlee Montoya (6th grade), Mary Lane Newman (school psychologist)
 - c. 6th Grade Boot Camp
 - i. Targeting students who would benefit from more instruction on self-advocacy, stress management and relaxation, friendships, and there was also a parent session.
 - ii. Sam Robinson asked: is there any data being collected on 6th grade boot camp so we can determine how effective it was and make some adjustments?

- f. 7th Grade College and Career Readiness Meetings
 - i. All 7th grade students meet individually with a counselor to discuss college and career goals.
- g. Games on the Green
 - i. 6th grade lunch activities on Fridays in August and September
- h. Safe UT app taught to all students during social studies classes
 - i. There was some discussion about how often this service is used.
- i. Looking Ahead: High school, college & careers night

 - ii. Mrs. Anderson talked about how No Fuss Fundraiser money is spent to pay teachers an hourly rate for preparing and presenting Club Thursday clubs.

 - a. Mrs. Anderson mentioned that her District Leadership meetings are on Thursdays and it is difficult to get back to DPMS by 3:00 form these meetings.

- 8. Land Trust Review
 - a. **Goal 1: Math:** Currently 61% of all students were scoring proficient on the 2016-17 SAGE math. Our goal is that by the end of the 2018-19 year, 65% of students will be proficient on the SAGE assessment.
 - b. Action steps, including a budget of \$26,975 to complete the steps, were shared.
 - c. **Goal 2: Science:** Currently, 88% of DPMS students are proficient on end-of-unit science assessments. However, only 64% of our special education students are proficient on end-of-unit science assessments. Ord goal is that 90% of our overall student body achieve proficiency on end-of-unit science tests while increasing proficient of our special education to 70%. This will reduce...

- d. Action steps, including a \$63,900 budget, to complete the steps, were shared.
- e. **Goal 3: Writing through ELA and Social Studies:** After focusing for 2 years on thesis development, use of evidence, and elaboration on evidence, DPMS saw 40 points of growth on the SAGE writing test. Teachers are seeing a need for increased alignment and continued improvement on writing. Each team will administer a common pre-assessment at the beginning of the school year. By the end of the school year
- f. Action steps, including a \$70,000 budget, to complete the steps, were shared.
- g. \$15,000 carryover from 2017-2018.
- h. There is an estimated \$5,697 carryover for 2019-2020.
- i. There was a question about whether Land Trust money can be used on elective courses or only core classes.
- j. Only Core Classes according to the code that governs Land Trust monies.

 - g. Holly N. made a motion to establish a survey for parent input on the standards and qualities that are important to them in the school with Dr. Briscoe's help. Alex N. and Sam R. 2nd the motion. (The motion passes unanimously.)
 - h. Vanessa C. clarified that we can ask about lunch times, passing times in the hallways, if their child uses their locker.

- i. Holly has a second motion: I propose we have a special meeting with Dr. Briscoe to evaluate a schedule and to clarify the CSD policy and regulations regarding schedule changes. We are not voting on a specific schedule we are only agreeing to consider one schedule to compare to the status quo. Mike N seconded. (Vote: 8 for motion passes.)
