Step 1- Application: Complete application and submit by the deadline. You will need to login to csd docs to complete this: Click here for Application Link

Step 2- Portfolio: You will be notified by Dr Segura if your application is approved and if you are continuing in the competition.

Theatre Portfolio Requirements (Bring to Interview -No Portfolio Submission Required)

- You will not be submitting a Portfolio. All items listed below will be shared at your Interview:
 - Perform two contrasting monologues.
 - Each monologue should be between 1 minute and 2 minutes in length. One of your monologues may be a Musical Theatre song, but that song should emphasize acting.
 - Provide a theatrical resumé.
 - Resumé should prominently feature your name and be well organized and typed. This is your opportunity to display any training, education, and experience you have had, both at Draper Park, and at other schools or community theaters. Theatrical resumés differ from professional work-place resumés. Format your resumé appropriately.

Step 3 -Performance and Interview: (A scheduled appointment for March 22, 2024) Requirements:

- Students will perform both of their chosen monologues.
 - Please make sure your monologues are memorized and well-rehearsed. A rubric for judging is included on the next page.
- Students will be asked a series of questions about their resumés and the impact theatre has had on their life.
